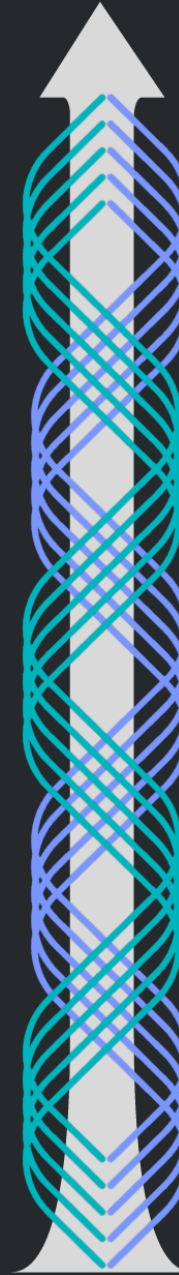

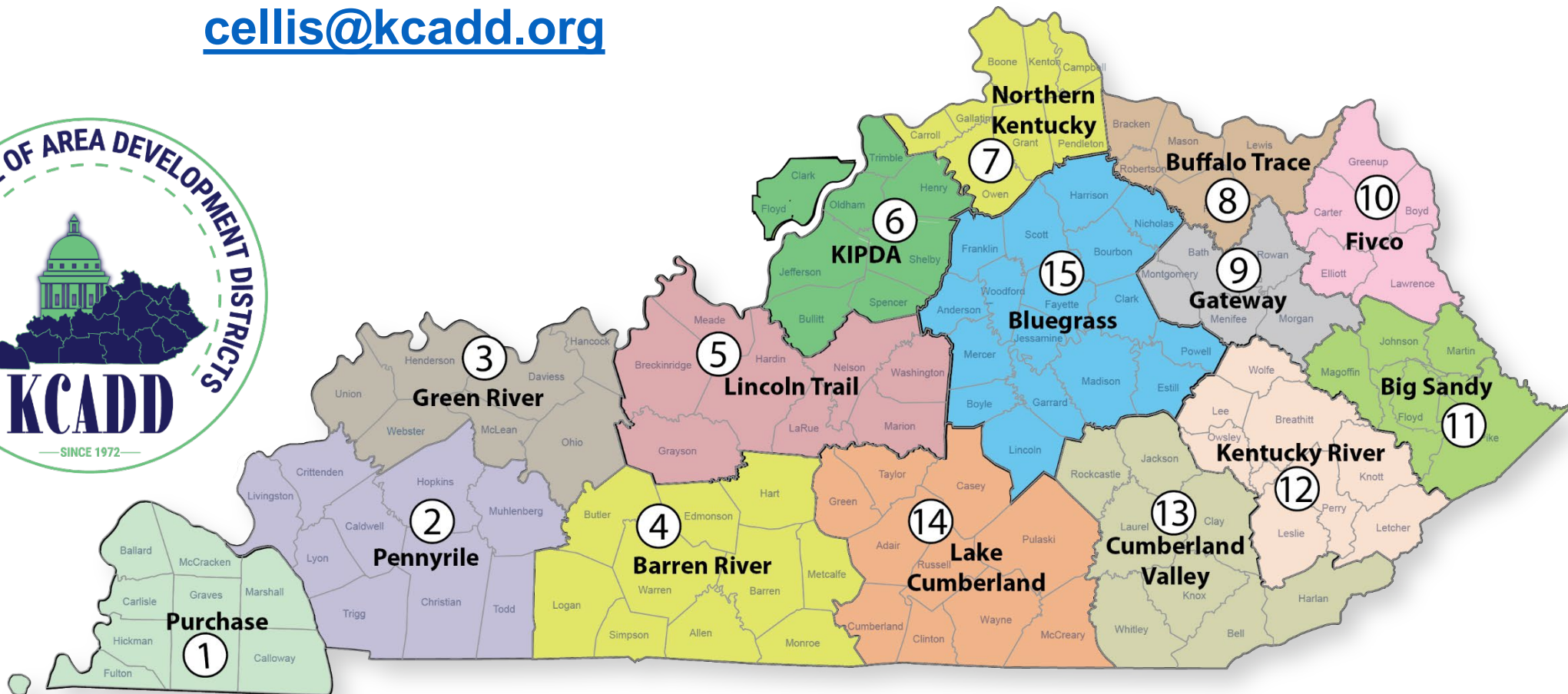

KEY PROGRAM DEFINITIONS

Eligible Grant Recipient	County or City Governing Body 501 (c)(3) nonprofit charitable organization engaged in public benefits improvements
Eligible Project	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Publicly owned property;▪ Property to be acquired which comes with either of the following:<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Legally binding letter of intent or option for the sale to an Eligible Grant Recipient; OR○ Legally binding sale agreement for the sale to an Eligible Grant Recipient▪ Private property on which a project is located that is in the public interest, for a public purpose and benefits an eligible community.
Eligible Use	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Enhance economic vitality, including revitalization of structures with a public purpose or benefit;▪ Promote or develop an artistic or philanthropic purpose;▪ Improve traditional infrastructure;▪ Create or enhance telecommunications infrastructure;▪ Promote agricultural activities and development;▪ Enhance development of previously mined areas or areas previously used by the coal industry and other industrial activities into uses that diversify the local economy;▪ Create or expand recreational facilities;▪ Acquire private property that promotes local economic vitality & housing development/enhancement;▪ Preserve or enhance buildings that are of local historic or economic interest;▪ Restore or create retail facilities, including related service, parking and transportation facilities, to revitalize decaying downtown areas;▪ Construct or expand other facilities that promote or enhance economic development or tourism opportunities;▪ Provide facilities and activities for local residents that enhance quality of life; <p>* Program requires a local participation</p>

SCORING

GRANT PROGRAM OF 2024



- **New and improved process from legislation to lessen emphasis on evaluation**
- **Applications required to be scored based on Return on Investment and Relative Positive Impact**
- **To qualify for funding, an applicant must earn a minimum score of 60 points.**

Local Match Requirement

GRANT PROGRAM OF 2024

- County Population Ranking is determined by the following:
 - Population Density Ranking + 10 year % Change in Population Ranking
- Local match will be between 1% and 5%
- Calculation of \$ amount of local match required (for regional projects, will be sum for every county participating):

$$\frac{\text{Requested GRANT Program of 2024 Funding}}{\text{\# of Counties}} \times \text{Required County \% for each County}$$

Application Submission -

Applications due by the 1st of each month – all applications should be emailed to ced.grant2024@ky.gov



2.

Review, Score, Rank -

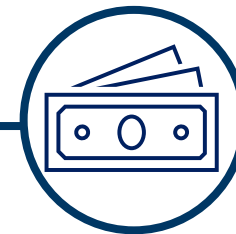
Finalized by the end of each month if completed application was received without any errors or omissions



3.

Notification, Agreement and Decision -

Month following completion of Review, Score, Rank



4.
