Project Description: The Princeton Electric Plant Board is requesting GRANT program funding for a critical infrastructure project designed to

significantly enhance the safety, reliability, and resilience of the electric grid serving the City of Princeton and Caldwell County, Kentucky. PEPB is upgrading its power distribution system by replacing 68 wooden poles with high-strength steel poles designed to withstand winds up to 140 mph, improving durability during extreme weather events, and reducing power outages. The project also includes installing 15 automated switches and a new fiber optic line for better communication, enhancing electric service reliability for both commercial and residential customers.
