



SPECIAL MEETING THURSDAY, AUGUST 7, 2025 MINUTES

A special meeting of the Kentucky Film Leadership Council (KLFC) convened at 3:02 p.m. on Thursday, August 7, 2025, through both in person attendance and video conference. The primary location for the meeting where all members could be seen and heard and the public was able to attend in accordance with KRS 61.826 and 61.840 was the Conference Room at 500 Mero Street, Mayo-Underwood Bldg, 5th Fl, Frankfort, Kentucky. While participants, media and members of the general public were able to attend the council meeting in person at the primary location, space was limited, and attendees were encouraged to join the meeting virtually and provided a link for a video teleconference.

CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

Soozie Eastman, Chairperson of KFLC, called the meeting to order and verified press notification. Molly Lancaster called the roll.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A motion was introduced by Soozie Eastman to approve the minutes of the Kentucky Film Leadership Council special working group meeting held on Thursday, July 24, 2025. Misdee Wrigley Miller made the motion and was seconded by Secretary Jeff Noel. The motion carried without opposition.

SUBCOMMITTEE REPORTS

The three subcommittees presented reports to the full Council following small meetings that were held the previous week.

Vision/Mission Subcommittee

Misdee Wrigley Miller, Soozie Eastman and Jeff Noel met on Wednesday, August 6, to formulate both a comprehensive mission and vision statement for the KFLC. The language of the proposed statement was, as follows:

"Kentucky Film Leadership Council Mission Statement

The Kentucky Film Leadership Council is dedicated to fostering a vibrant and sustainable entertainment industry in the Commonwealth. Our mission is to promote the state as a premier destination for production by offering robust tax incentives, building and supporting local talent, attracting diverse productions, and showcasing Kentucky's unique landscapes. Through collaboration, education, and advocacy, we will drive economic growth, create opportunities for communities and individuals alike, while celebrating the art of storytelling to continually develop world renowned infrastructure across our production-friendly state.

Kentucky Film Leadership Council Vision Statement

The Kentucky Film Leadership Council vision is to position Kentucky as a leading hub for innovative entertainment production, where storytellers, artists, and communities collaborate to drive economic prosperity, cultural growth, and deeper appreciation of the Commonwealth."

All comments were supportive. Soozie Eastman introduced a motion to accept the proposed statement. Secretary Lindy Casebier moved; Secretary Jeff Noel seconded the motion. The motion carried without opposition.

Executive Director Search Subcommittee

Soozie Eastman, Secretary Link and Secretary Noel met on Wednesday, August 6, to discuss the draft Executive Director Position Posting as presented by Soozie Eastman. After review and open discussion with the KFLC members, it was decided to modify as follows:

- Full time work week corrected to 37.5 from 40 hrs/week
- Remove yellow highlighting to emphasize open discussion no change
- List a probationary period of six-months

The posting will remain open for up to ninety (90) days, or until we select/hire a candidate. After the first twenty-one (21) days, KFLC can begin to screen and interview any candidates. The posting will be distributed on many employment sites and on the CED website for ease of review. All interested candidate's resumes will be collected by Shannon MacDonald.

Soozie Eastman proposed to create a subcommittee to review the incoming resumes for consideration. Proposed members include

- Soozie Eastman
- Misdee Wrigley Miller
- Steve Zahn

Soozie Eastman introduced a motion to accept the Executive Director Posting. Jeremy Winton moved; Secretary Jeff Noel seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Guidelines Subcommittee

Jeremy Winton, Misdee Wrigley Miller, and Steve Zahn presented a draft set of topics for discussion related to potential programmatic changes moving forward. There was extensive discussion on the topics as they were presented. Specifically, topics were changing the program's incentive caps, following industry standards on budgeting, prioritization during the project ranking process, including training partnerships, required levels of funding, administrative fees, documentation required in the application process, and treatment of previously committed funding for projects that elect to no longer proceed. The members of the Guidelines Subcommittee requested a second meeting with Chad Zimlich and Matt Wingate to clarify potential proposed changes to the current KEI Program guidelines and to create proposed comments to the KEI Program's administrative regulations through the notice and comment process. The Guidelines Subcommittee will present proposals at the August 28 KFLC meeting for consideration/approval.

Soozie Eastman introduced a motion to replace Steve Zahn with Soozie Eastman on the Guidelines Subcommittee due to Steve's extensive travel commitments. Misdee Wrigley Miller moved; Jeremy Winton seconded the motion. The motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

Kylee Palmer presented the KEI Program "cap summary," which identified the number of approved projects and approved incentives Year-to-Date, along with the remaining balance and number of proposed projects for the current month.

The following projects were presented for consideration by the KFLC:

1. Sunshine Films Florida LCC, production in Jefferson County, presented by Cody Pennington

Soozie Eastman introduced a motion to approve the project. Misdee Wrigley Miller moved; Secretary Jamie Link seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Jeremy Winton disclosed a financial interest in GR Film Slate 1, LLC and GR Film Slate 5, LLC, in accordance with the KFLC Bylaws, and refrained from participating in discussions relating to or taking any action on those projects. Jeremy Winton left the room during these discussions.

2. GR Film Slate 1 LLC, production in Hopkins County, presented by Tim Bates

Misdee Wrigley Miller inquired as to the overall budget for the project, which was noted as post-production only. Misdee Wrigley Miller also inquired as to the nature of the project. Kristi Kilday, on behalf of GR Film Slate 1, LLC, was present at the meeting and discussed the nature of the project being archival footage utilized to create 13 episodes of a true crime television series. Secretary Noel inquired whether the archival footage was shot in Kentucky. Kristi Kilday identified that the footage was not made in Kentucky but was shot in various locations throughout the world, and related to archival footage in the true crime genre.

Soozie Eastman introduced a motion to approve the project. Steve Zahn moved; Secretary Jeff Noel seconded. The motion carried with abstain.

3. GR Film Slate 5 LLC, production in Hopkins County, presented by Tim Bates

Soozie Eastman introduced a motion to approve the project. Secretary Jeff Noel moved to approve; Steve Zahn seconded. The motion carried with abstain.

Jeremy Winton returned to the meeting to discuss the remaining projects.

4. Frontier Lives LLC, production in Edmonson, Jefferson, and Powell counties, presented by Brennan Tucker

Brennan Tucker identified that a page of the budget needed to be substituted and reprinted for the Council's consideration of the project. After discussion of Wellness Trails, LLC, below, the Council returned to this topic to discuss the project.

Additional questions regarding the production were discussed. Soozie Eastman made a motion to table consideration of the project, requesting the documentation outlined below. Misdee Wrigley Miller seconded the motion. The motion carried.

5. Wellness Trails LLC, production in several counties, presented by Brennan Tucker

Additional questions regarding the production were discussed. Soozie Eastman introduced a motion to table consideration of the project, requesting the documentation outlined below. Secretary Noel made the motion; Misdee Miller Wrigley seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The KLFC identified the following items requested to be provided for the tabled projects:

- Additional forms of proof of funding (bank statements, contracts, etc.)
- Plans/documentation for distribution
- Deal memos (agreements between key personnel and the applicant)
- Detailed, episode-by-episode synopsis and involved/committed talent
- Descriptive breakdown of budget
- Explanation of production timing Both projects seem to use the same key personnel, such as the DP

The KFLC's next regular scheduled meeting is August 28, 2025.

ADJOURNMENT

Secretary Lindy Casesier made a motion to adjourn. The motion was seconded by Misdee Wrigley Miller. The motion passed without opposition.

Kentucky Film Leadership Council's Proposed Comments for 307 KAR 1:080E and 1:080 – Kentucky Entertainment Incentive Program (effective after July 1, 2025)


- Comment 1: The Kentucky Film Leadership Council finds it appropriate to soften the prohibition on qualifying payroll expenditures paid to producers with a financial interest in the approved company, as found in Section 2(2). In lieu of prohibition, the Council suggests that, in order for an approved company to receive incentives based upon salaries paid to above-the-line production crew with a financial interest in the approved company, the financial interest be disclosed and accompanied by supporting documentation, to the Council's and Cabinet's satisfaction, demonstrating the payroll expenditure was reasonable within market rates.
- **Comment 2:** The Kentucky Film Leadership Council finds it appropriate to include a general requirement that applicants demonstrate overall budgets, including payroll expenditures and other expenditures, are reasonable within market rates.
- Comment 3: The Kentucky Film Leadership Council finds it appropriate to remove the limitation on the total annual amount of incentive awards able to be received by any single approved company found in Section 5(1) because of the current lack of diversity of potential approved companies.
- Comment 4: The Kentucky Film Leadership Council finds it appropriate to change the limitation on the monthly approved incentives found in Section 5(2) from ten percent (10%) of the total annual tax credit cap to ten million dollars (\$10,000,000) of incentive allocations per month to allow the Council more flexibility to allocate these funds earlier in the year. In addition, allow the Council the ability to commit more than this cap in a month in the event a well-scoring project's anticipated qualifying expenditures and payroll expenditures exceeds this amount.
- Comment 5: The Kentucky Film Leadership Council finds it appropriate to strengthen the proof of funding requirements throughout the regulation, requiring at least 50% of the project funding to be committed as demonstrated through bonds, payroll statements, bank statements, or financing and funding contracts. The Council likewise recommends, in the event the project is reliant upon a commitment letter, applicants must demonstrate 25% of committed funds in an escrow account, along with presenting a corresponding balance sheet or letter from an accredited financial institution, attorney, or accountant holding the funds.
- **Comment 6**: The Kentucky Film Leadership Council recommends the Kentucky Cabinet for Economic Development reduce the weight given to whether a project has a

distribution contract and, instead, include within the economic analysis in Section 6 the following analyses:

- 1. Whether the project is fully funded;
- 2. What percentage of the project's overall spend will be in Kentucky;
- 3. The number of employed Kentucky residents compared to the total crew;
- 4. The ratio of total amount of incentives sought compared to the number of Kentucky-based below-the-line production crew members employed (dollar-per-Kentucky-job number);
- 5. The percentage of incentives sought attributable to non-Kentucky-based production crew members; and
- 6. Whether the production offers one or more training programs to build a Kentucky crew base. These programs should be associated with: (1) an accredited Kentucky educational institution; (2) a local trade association; or (3) a regional educational or trade association.

Comment 7: The Kentucky Film Leadership Council finds it appropriate to request additional information from applicant companies, including:

- 1. plans and related documentation regarding distribution;
- 2. deal memos between applicant companies and key personnel;
- 3. detailed episode-by-episode synopsis and committed talent;
- detailed breakdowns of budgets, including all estimated line items used to support claimed qualifying payroll expenditures and qualifying expenditures;

- 5. detailed explanation of timing of production in the event there are commonly held or related applicants with overlapping personnel.

MOTION PICTURE ASSOCIATION

On behalf of the Motion Picture Association (MPA), and our member companies¹, we appreciate the opportunity to offer our comments on the proposed changes to the regulations for the Kentucky Entertainment Incentive Program for your consideration. All proposed amendments to the draft regulations are underlined in the following text. We appreciate your consideration of our comments and suggestions and are available to answer any questions at your convenience.

"Continuous Film Production" Designation

The MPA respectfully recommends additions to the draft regulations and/or administrative guidance that would clarify how productions can qualify under the "continuous film production" designation, and how the \$1MM per position limit in payroll expenditures would be administered. For example, it would be helpful to specify that the designation can include a series of episodes of a streaming or television production, or a series of separate feature films produced by the same production company or commonly owned companies that in the aggregate satisfy the \$10MM spending requirement and separately reach the \$1.5MM per production spend. In addition, the MPA recommends that the regulations specify an amount of minimum production days required across a season for an episodic series to qualify as a "continuous film production." There may be instances where a particular episode will film in under 12 days, but the threshold should include total aggregate production days for the season, versus the individual days by episode.

The MPA recommends further that the draft regulations and/or administrative guidance provide flexibility for how a continuous film production that crosses two calendar years can meet the minimum spending requirement. For example, there may be a instance where a continuous film production has an aggregate budget of \$20MM but spends less than \$10MM in one calendar year. The regulations should make allowances for these instances so that productions are not unduly penalized when their physical production schedules cross over into a new calendar year.

Per Person Limit on Payroll Expenditures

The MPA respectfully requests clarification on the applicability of the per person limit on payroll expenditures to productions that are designated as continuous film productions. Specifically, for purposes of determining qualifying payroll expenditures of a television or streaming series that is designated a Continuous Film Production, can the limitation of \$1,000,000 in payroll expenditures per person paid to non-resident above-the-line production crew be applied per episode (versus total series budget) provided that the minimum requirements for a Continuous Film Production are otherwise satisfied?

Notably, applying the \$1MM per person limit for payroll expenditures per episode as opposed to the entire series would encourage episodic shows with larger budgets to film in the

Commonwealth. Accordingly, the MPA recommends that the regulations afford the flexibility provided in the statute as to how this limitation is applied.

For your consideration, below are recommended guidelines for episodic series under the "continuous film production" category.

For purposes of satisfying the requirements of a Continuous Film Production (KRS 154.61-010(7), a feature film, documentary, and individual episode of a television or streaming series shall qualify as a motion picture or entertainment production provided the production has a projected budget of a minimum of \$10,000,000 per calendar year, and each episode of the series has an average budget of at least \$1,500,000.

For purposes of determining Qualifying Payroll Expenditures of a television series that is a Continuous Film Production, the limitation of \$1,000,000 in payroll expenditures per person paid to above-the-line production crew that are not Kentucky residents shall apply per episode provided the minimum requirements for a Continuous Film Production are otherwise satisfied.

Economic Analysis

In order to ensure that applications are for legitimate professional productions in accordance with the policy objectives of the state, the MPA recommends that the regulations specify the types of distribution contracts that will be considered as part of the economic impact analysis for each application.

Under Section 6(2)(f) of the regulations, we suggest the following:

(f) the presence of a distribution contract <u>for theatrical release</u>, a <u>broadcast or cable television</u> <u>network or streaming service</u>.

We further recommend including continuous scripted series as a factor in ranking the applications as follows:

(3) The Cabinet shall then rank each application submitted under the program based upon the purposes set forth in KRS 154.61-020(I)(a) through (d). Ranking shall prioritize applications with more *continuous productions that are scripted series*, Kentucky-based jobs, employed Kentucky residents, and percentage of spend going to Kentucky-based vendors in relation to the total amount of proposed spend on a project or incentives sought by an eligible company.

Inclusion of Fringe Benefits and Per Diem as Qualifying Expenditures

Finally, the MPA respectfully recommends that the regulations and/or administrative guidance clarify that fringe benefits and per diem are included in the definition of qualifying expenditures for the purposes of the KEI. Fringe benefits and per diem are a part of the total compensation paid to employees in the production industry and the majority of states include these as permissible qualifying expenditures. Disqualifying these expenditures from the KEI would make

the Commonwealth an outlier and place it at a competitive disadvantage. For your reference, we've attached a copy of the Georgia Film Production Tax Credit General Guidelines.

Requirement to Identify Vendors on Daily Production Reports

The draft regulations require that persons or vendors providing services rendered on set be identified on the daily production reports or that the production provides other reasonable evidence that such services were rendered on set. This type of information is not typically listed on a daily production report and providing it will be an administrative burden with no tangible benefits.

The State of Georgia does require that non-resident vendors who are providing services at a filming site be identified in the daily production reports provided to the Department of Revenue as part of the audit process, and that withholding must be paid on those employees in order for those wages to be considered qualified expenditures. This compliance reporting is required because Georgia allows for the use of non-resident vendors at filming sites only.

In contrast, the KEI does not allow payments to non-resident vendors to qualify as qualified expenditures, whether or not they were performing services on a filming site, and any eligible KY vendors will be captured during the audit process. Consequently, we recommend that the requirement for vendors to be listed on the daily production report be removed.



GEORGIA FILM PRODUCTION TAX CREDIT GENERAL GUIDELINES March 15, 2023

The following chart represents expenditures that apply only to the film production portion of the Film Tax Credit codified in Code Section 48-7-40.26 (not to the interactive entertainment portion of the Film Tax Credit). This chart does not apply to the Postproduction Film Tax Credit (codified in Code Section 48-7-40.26A, effective January 1, 2018), or the Musical Tax Credit (codified in Code Section 48-7-40.33, effective January 1, 2018). Any qualified production expenditures claimed under the Postproduction Tax Credit or Musical Tax Credit are not eligible for the Film Tax Credit. The Georgia Department of Revenue has determined the expenditures listed herein are generally "directly used" in a qualified production activity, as defined by Georgia Regulation 560-7-8-45, subject to the following overarching guidelines:

- 1 Actual facts and circumstances. The actual facts and circumstances of the transaction may change the determination.
- 2 All expenditures must meet any applicable Georgia Department of Economic Development rules included in Chapter 159-1-1.
- 3 Loan-out Companies. All payments to loan-out companies for services provided are subject to withholding rules unless the payment is for reimbursement of expenses that are not required to be included in the loan-out compensation.
- 4 Georgia Vendor requirement Goods. All purchases and rentals of tangible personal property used in the production must be from a qualified Georgia Vendor as defined by Regulaton 560-7-8-.45.
- 5 Georgia Vendor requirement Services not at the filming site. All services that are not provided at the filming site must be provided by a Georgia vendor as defined by Regulaton 560-7-8-.45 and can be included only to the extent the service is performed in Georgia.
- 6 Other expenses. Other expenses must meet any applicable statutory and regulatory requirements.

This chart is intended to provide a guideline regarding the qualification of certain expenditures incurred during the production of a project in Georgia. Not all potential qualified expenditures are listed and account numbers/categories are for example purposes only. Each production company may require a different numbering or categorization system for budgeting and accounting purposes.
