Old Business

BSSC Socioeconomic Index - Philip Flynn

By statute, the BSSC Board is required to provide preferential scoring to companies located in communities with a lower socioeconomic status.

Therefore, Mr. Philip Flynn (CED staff economist) presented a report on the Socioeconomic Index Study, which is used to determine the BSSC "area of need" for scoring purposes. A copy of this presentation was provided in the board book to the Board members.

Mr. Flynn talked about the six metrics in which the BSSC Socioeconomic Index is measured by:

- Adult population with high school education or higher

- Three year average unemployment rate in each county
- Per capita personal income for 2016
- Annual wage and salary
- Annual average poverty rate
- Per capita estimated Gross Domestic Product by county

Compared to last year, 21 counties had some sort of fluctuation. These were not major changes, and some were only a one-tier change. It is anticipated that there will be some movement year in and year out.

Audit update MCM CPAs & Advisors – Sarah Butler

Ms. Butler informed the BSSC Board that the auditors would be at the Economic Development Cabinet starting on July 16, 2018 to begin the audit.

New Business

<u>Grant-in-Aid / Skills-Training-Investment-Credit Guidelines / Commitment Grant Guidelines – Randy Fox</u>

House Bill 557 was signed by the Governor on April 26, 2018. As a result of this legislation, changes to the KRS 154.12 will become effective on July 14, 2018. Staff presented proposed changes to the Grant-in-Aid + Skills-Training-Investment-Credit according to the new statutes for approval:

- 1.) Introduction of establishment of the BSSC and the Statute definitions of Skills Upgrade Training and Occupational Upgrade Training
- 2.) Removed purpose and duty "To administer any special state appropriations for customized business and industry-specific training" and aligned the purpose and duties according to KRS 154.12-206
- 3.) Board Meeting Schedule change due to the July 14th effective date of HB557. The staff cannot accept applications prior to July 14th. The new deadline will be July 20th and the board meeting will be August 29th.
- 4.) GIA purpose and maximum funding amount 1 application per facility/location
- 5.) STIC purpose and maximum credit amount 1 application per biennium
- 6.) Qualified company addition of Agribusiness see KRS 154.12-010 definition "Agribusiness" means the processing of raw agricultural products, including but not limited to timber and industrial hemp, or the performance of value-added functions with regard to raw agricultural products; Replaced public or non-profit hospitals to healthcare
- 7.) Consortia/Industry Partnerships Two companies instead of three companies to be a consortia
- 8.) Co-Applicant No change
- 9.) Qualified Employee: 1) Permanent full time employee; 2) Kentucky

- Resident; Minimum hourly compensation of \$12.51; Removed the 90 day retention requirement
- 10.) Eligible Training Provider No change
- 11.) Eligible Training Costs Changed hospitals to healthcare; Safety, mandated, and regulatory training is eligible if it totals no more than 25% of the overall eligible training hours for both GIA and STIC.
- 12.) In-House Training No change
- 13.) Educational Institution and Consultant Training No change
- 14.) Instructional Materials and Supplies No change
- 15.) Employee Wages No change
- 16.) Registered Apprenticeships \$2,000 eligible cost for all four years on both GIA and STIC
- 17.) Consortia Expenses No change
- 18.) Ineligible Training Costs added KCTCS TRAINS training is ineligible.
- 19.) BSSC Process Added the W-9 Form; GIA interim disbursements limited to 1; Closeout Process defined; Documentation submission 2 months and staff authorization of one-time 3-month extension for documentation only.
- 20.) Modifications Consortia Only
- 21.) Training Documentation No change
- 22.) Added the website
- 23.) Organized Labor No change
- 24.) Equal Opportunity No change
- 25.) Application Scoring STIC now will be scored; Decreased minimum score to 65 points; added all American Veterans
- 26.) Area of Need Updated to reflect most recent Socioeconomic Index results.
- 27.) No more PEQ Survey Monkey after the end of each fiscal year

These recommendations came as a motion from the Executive Committee, Randy Fox seconded the motion to accept these recommended Guidelines changes, and Carl Lay moved to accept the proposed changes. Motion carried.

Guideline Exceptions for Commitment Grants - Sarah Butler

Ms. Butler presented proposed changes to the BSSC Commitment Grant Guideline Exceptions for approval:

- May be approved and awarded up to \$ 200,000 per applicant
- Awards and approvals may include up to 25% retroactive training activities within sixty (60) days prior to the company's acceptance of proposal
- Commitment Grants will have separate and distinct application and reimbursement worksheet
- Extensions may be authorized for certain Cabinet Commitment Projects
- Train the trainer travel is an eligible expense

Eston Glover entertained a motion to accept the recommended guidelines and exceptions to commitment grants. Torsten Langguth second the motion. Motion carried.

Kentucky Work Ready Communities - Sarah Butler

Ms. Butler mentioned that Governor Bevin announced that Christian County has been certified as the newest Kentucky Work Ready Community.

OBLIGATION TO DISCLOSE AND ABSTAIN

- A state policy-making or regulatory board or commission member must disclose to other members of the board, commission, authority, council or committee of which he or she is a member, any direct or indirect interest in any undertaking that puts the member's personal interest in conflict with that of the board or commission on which he or she serves.
- This disclosure must be made in writing or must be recorded in the minutes of a meeting or the board or commission. formal A
- disclose a direct or indirect interest is required to abstain from all decisions profession, A member who is required to publicly concerning his or her interest if the decision will affect him or her as a occupation, or group differently from other members of the business, profession, of a business, occupation or group member A

EXAMPLES

- A company owned by a member of the Horse Park Commission is prohibited from selling tems to the Horse Park gift shop.
- If the brother of a member of the Executive Branch Ethics Commission wanted to provide legal services for the Commission, the member would be required to disclose his potential conflict of interest and abstain from voting on whether the Commission should contract with his brother.
